REFORMATION SUNDAY

October 27, 2019 Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd Olney, Maryland **Let us go into the house of the Lord.** We are thankful that you have come to worship the Lord with us today. We pray that you will return soon.

Reformation Sunday Today we observe Reformation Sunday, commemorating the day in October, 1517, when a little-known German friar and theology professor named Martin Luther published his Ninety-five Theses challenging abuses within the Western Church. This action unintentionally sparked a Bible-based, Gospel-centered revolution in the Church that has come to be known as the Reformation. The heart of the Reformation was a rediscovery of the Good News of God's grace, received through faith in Christ: In the words of St. Paul, "We hold that one is justified by faith, apart from works of the law."

Desiring to make the Gospel accessible to the common people, Luther (with the assistance of his colleague Philipp Melanchthon and others) translated the Bible into German and then went on to create a German order of worship. Today's service is based on Luther's German Mass of 1526 and the subsequent Lutheran service orders that developed during and following Luther's lifetime. In these services, Luther and his coworkers reformed, rather than abolished, the existing liturgy, simplifying it and removing legendary and legalistic accretions that had been added during the Middle Ages. Additionally, they replaced the Latin of the existing liturgy with German hymns and simple chants, to encourage congregational singing. In this way, the laity, who had formerly been largely passive spectators in the Mass, became active participants in a service that, through song, scripture, and sermon, proclaimed the Good News of God's grace in their own native tongue.

We pray that as you participate in this service today, that same Good News, which once transformed the career of a lowly German monk—and with it the world—would likewise transform your life, now and to life everlasting.

Holy Communion is celebrated this morning. Holy Communion is:

- + The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ received "in, with, and under" the bread and wine for God's people. *(Matthew 26:26, 28)*
- + Coming to the table believing the words "given and shed FOR YOU." Preparation might involve three questions: Do I believe in the Lord Jesus Christ? Am I sorry for my sins? Am I ready to lead a new life?
- + God's grace in "forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation." (*Matthew 26:28; 1 Peter 1:18-19; Romans 6:8-9; Romans 8:31-32*)



Of repentance we teach that for those that have fallen after Baptism there is remission of sins whenever they are converted; and that the Church ought to impart Absolution to those thus returning to repentance.

²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.



Now, what is the Sacrament of the Altar?

Answer: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, in and under the bread and wine which we Christians are commanded by the Word of Christ to eat and to drink. And as we have said of Baptism that it is not simple water, so here also we say the Sacrament is bread and wine, but not mere bread and wine, such as are ordinarily served at the table, but bread and wine comprehended in, and connected with, the Word of God.

It is the Word (I say) which makes and distinguishes this Sacrament, so that it is not mere bread and wine, but is, and is called, the body and blood of Christ. For it is said: Accedat verbum ad elementum, et fit sacramentum. If the Word be joined to the element it becomes a Sacrament. This saying of St. Augustine is so properly and so well put that he has scarcely said anything better. The Word must make a Sacrament of the element, else it remains a mere element. Now, it is not the word or ordinance of a prince or emperor, but of the sublime Majesty, at whose feet all creatures should fall, and affirm it is as He says, and accept it with all reverence, fear, and humility.

With this Word you can strengthen your conscience and say: If a hundred thousand devils, together with all fanatics, should rush forward, crying, How can bread and wine be the body and blood of Christ? etc., I know that all spirits and scholars together are not as wise as is the Divine

Majesty in His little finger. Now here stands the Word of Christ: Take, eat; this is My body; Drink ye all of it; this is the new testament in My blood, etc. Here we


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
